RECYCLING COMES TO NORTONVILLE

JCN and the city of Nortonville have combined resources to begin a recycling project in Nortonville. Beginning the week of November 16th, patrons may drop off the following items in one of two recycling trailers:

- 1) Plastics (number 1 and number 2), or clear plastics such as water bottles and opaque plastics, such as milk jugs - please remove the lids
- 2) Newspapers
- 3) White paper – black ink only (such as copy paper)
- 4) Color paper or paper with color pictures
- 5) Tin cans - please remove labels
- 6) Cardboard



We will NOT be recycling glass or aluminum. This project is being done as a community service for patrons and as a science project for students at EMS. Volunteers will be helping our staff take the trailers to Holton to the recycling center. Please help make this a successful project.
